## Genre flow chart

Screenreaders need to be able to identify the basic tone and genre of the scripts they read. Some stories may be hard to place, but all should at least be able to be summed up using no more than ONE word from each level of the following flow chart.

**Root Genres** define the overarching way a story is produced in the most basic and ancient of concepts:



**Form Genres** refine the **Root Genre** and give shape to the look, length, tone, and audience of the story.
